George Dalbergs, Dave Drake, John Mytroen (the Rookie) and myself made a pilgrimage to the Detroit International Auto Show. Is there no tradition? The Rookie is to buy breakfast for the crew. No ... the Rookie abandoned us at a 401 Tim Horton's to get a "Breakfast Muffin" banquet on his own. Is there no respect for somebody's vehicle? No ... the Rookie brought his exploding "Breakfast Muffin" banquet into Dave's (i.e. Gloria's) van - I think there is still cheese bits ground into the upholstery. Oh yes, the Rookie also forgot to bring a satchel to pick up the Show brochures. All was not lost though, as there were more manufacturers than years past, and the new and exciting models definitely made the day a success.

For many years I've heard, read and dreamed of attending the annual Detroit Auto Show. It's often the unveiling of new models that set the stage for shows around the world for the rest of the year and cars we will see in years to come. Little did I know this would be my year to finally experience the show first hand. Over the years many NCC members have made the trip and this year again a group had decided to go but as Willy Wilkinson was sick they had an empty seat. So on Tuesday Jan 18th I was to meet George Dalbergs and Harold Anders at George's place at 5 am. I won't get into what time I had to get up to be at George's place by 5 am. And of course the Port Colborne area was hit with snow and freezing rain overnight just to make the trip a little more interesting.

Off we went George, Harold and I to meet Dave Drake and start our journey. By now the freezing rain had turned to snow and a bit of slush but nothing can stop 4 determined gear heads. We were underway from Dave and Gloria's place before 6 am and with Dave's knowledge of back roads made our way to Brantford and then across to Woodstock and down to the Windsor Detroit area. Crossing through the tunnel at 9:30 we missed the morning rush hour and were parked and at the famous

Cobo Center before 10 am.. Twelve dollars later (\$6 for old(er) guys) and we're in facing some of the most spectacular car displays in the world.

The first exhibit was the Mercedes exhibit and after looking over an SLR McLaren gull wing what meets our eye is a beautiful 2011 model in a semi gloss type of paint. It's hard to describe but it's not as flat as primer and not shiny but still smooth. A kind of "soft" looking finish. If this was the only one we saw it wouldn't be worth mentioning but there were more of them from other manufacturers. Almost like instead of a clear coat a satin finish was sprayed on. Now the Hyundai exhibit had some beautiful new models. The Hyundai Equus starts at \$58,000 US but George likes the \$65,400 US model. What's so nice you ask. First, it's very luxurious certainly a Benz or Audi fighter but most interesting were the back seats. They have full control of heating, AC, audio and video on a centre console AND reclining rear seats. They recline like a real reclining chair and literally stretch right out. And get this... the rear seat passenger wants a little more room well that's easy as you have a set of buttons to control the front seat! If George wins the lottery I guarantee there will be one of these in his driveway.

Then we saw Donald Trump's favorite car the Maybach (Mercedes answer Rolls Royce) and were then off to the Ford Exhibit. Two things really caught our eye at the Ford exhibit. Since Ford are dropping the Crown Vic as a police car they had some "Interceptors" on display. They are the new Taurus and lettered up ones were neat but the ghost car was the ultimate cruiser. Nice dark colour with nothing flashy just gobs of power and obviously real heavy duty! Ford was showing off all their other 2011 new models but the Boss 302 Mustangs are very nice. **DETROIT — General Motors Co. sold more cars and trucks in China last year than it did in the U.S., for the first time in the company's 102-year history.**

Despite GM's growth in China, Toyota Motor Corp. held onto the title of world's largest automaker. The Japanese company reported 8.42 million sales worldwide last year. That's 30,000 more than GM's 8.39 million.

GM said Monday that it sold 2.35 million vehicles in fast-growing China, about 136,000 more than it sold in the U.S., with China sales surging 29 percent as an expanding middle class gained wealth. Sales in the U.S., including heavy-duty vehicles, rose 6.3 percent as GM continued to rebound from its 2009 stay in bankruptcy protection.

GM expects its sales growth to continue, and industry analysts say it may once again dethrone Toyota as the global sales leader this year. GM will announce Monday that it's adding a third shift to a pickup truck assembly plant in Flint, Mich., to meet an expected increase in demand as the U.S. economic recovery continues.

# 200mph

## 200mph+ Corvette unveiled

**Fastest ever Corvette unveiled at the Detroit Motor Show.**

If there's one thing the standard Corvette is not short of, it's pace. But that hasn't stopped engineers at General Motors from giving it a tune-up and making their legendary performance car one of the fastest models in the world.

The ZR1 is one of the stars at this week's Detroit Motor Show thanks to its all-American style and incredible performance potential. Look through the clear bonnet window and you get a glimpse of the Vette's powerhouse – a supercharged 6.2-litre V8.



Producing an incredible 620bhp and 823Nm of torque, the rear-wheel drive model is a true supercar. The ZR1's top speed is described as being “at least 200mph”, while bosses remain tight lipped about the car's 0-60mph time.

With 19-inch wheels at the front and 20-inch rims at the rear the Corvette is a stunning sight in Detroit, drawing big crowds. Peer through the huge wheels and you will see enormous ceramic brakes giving the Vette the stopping power to match its acceleration.

Carbon fibre body panels are also fitted to reduce weight, while four tightly packed exhaust pipes at the rear give the ZR1 a classic Corvette look. The new model will be launched in the summer.

### Sensible Lane Usage

Reprint of an article by Jim Kenzie in the Toronto Star Wheels Section of July 28, 2010

The Highway Traffic Act for the province of Ontario states in Part X “Rules of the Road,” **Section 147, subsection 1:**

“Any vehicle travelling upon a roadway at less than the normal speed of traffic at the time and place shall, where practicable, be driven in the right-hand lane then available for traffic or as close as practicable to the right hand curb or edge of the roadway.” Exceptions are when the overtaking vehicle is passing, or the overtaken vehicle is preparing to turn left. And **Section 148, subsection 2:**

“Every person in charge of a vehicle or on horseback on a highway who is overtaken by a vehicle or equestrian travelling at a greater speed shall turn out to the right and allow the overtaking vehicle or equestrian to pass.” So, if someone CAN pass you on the right, you're violating section 147 (1) of the HTA. IF someone actually is passing you on the right, you are violating **section 147 (1) and 148(2).**

Note that neither of these provisions of the HTA makes any reference to the speed limit, only to “the normal speed of traffic at that time and place” and “a greater speed” respectively. Hence, these provisions apply regardless of how fast you and the other vehicle is travelling.

Note also that in Ontario (**section 150, subsection 1**) passing on the right is legal, providing “the movement can be made in safety” and that the road is wide enough to do it.

England and Germany have the best lane discipline. In Germany, the Drive Right/Pass Left is taken very seriously. They pull left, they pass, and move back right immediately.

So, what's wrong with us? Observing and/or enforcing proper lane discipline would make traffic move more smoothly, more swiftly and more safely. Reduced congestion would save fuel, save money, reduce emissions, and help your taxes go further.
