Car buff gears down after 114 purchases

He loves cars -- and it shows

Car enthusiast Lawrence Keighan hit a milestone recently.

The Port Colborne resident managed to keep a car for 2 1/2 years -- a record for the 76-year-old. In all, Keighan has owned 114 vehicles, of which 100 have been Ford products. For the past six decades, Keighan has purchased about two vehicles a year on average.

Most people buy a car every five to eight years. "I'm sort of slowing down," Keighan said of keeping his 2006 Lincoln Zepher for a "long" time.

"Since I'm retired now, I sort of slowed down and put it to one or two a year at the most."

Keighan said he got into binge car-buying after being hired as a traffic controller at the former Ford glass plant in Niagara Falls in 1969. As an employee, he was entitled to buy five vehicles a year with his company discount. And he did.

During his 23 years with the company, Keighan would buy a Mustang, Thunderbird, Ranger or some other vehicle, use it for at least six months and sell it at cost to a friend or relative.

Keighan said he did it "just for the fun of it. I love cars."

He keeps an impressive list, catalogued by year, keeping track of every vehicle he purchased. He didn't discriminate. "I went through the whole range of Ford products from Montegos to Mustangs to Granadas to Bobcats to Cougars -- I tried them all," Keighan said.

But there's only a few cars Keighan still pines over. The memory of his 1961 Austin-Healey convertible, a Britishmade car, still tugs at his heart. "I wish I still had that car," he said wistfully.

Keighan said he doesn't know why he loves cars so much. He just does.



He used to spend many hours puttering around antique car shows.

The car-crazed man also has another obsession: washing his vehicles.

They get a good cleaning at least twice a week.

"My neighbours tell me I'm going to wash the paint off, I wash them so often." Deciding what to drive in the morning depends on the weather, said Keighan, who currently owns a 2008 Lincoln MKX, 2007 Corvette convertible, and 2006 Chevrolet HHR.

"If the fleet's all clean, as I call it, and it's a nice sunny day, we'll take the convertible, put the top down. If it's a rainy day and one of the vehicles happens to be dirty, and that doesn't happen too often, we'll take the dirty one."

Keighan has quickly become one of Aaron Flonders' best customers.

A salesman at Ed Learn Ford Lincoln in St. Catharines, Flonders has sold or leased three vehicles to Keighan within the last four years.

Flonders has sold cars to Keighan's children, siblings, nieces and nephews. "For me, he's excellent," Flonders said. "I treat him right, and that's why he's sent me so many referrals."

- As of November 1, 2008, Chevrolet had produced 28,631 Corvettes, compared to 35,711 at that point the previous year.
- GM is laying off 110 employees from the Bowling Green factory this month as well as shutting down the plant for a 2 week period. This follows a layoff of 70 employees in the Fall and a 1 week plant closure in December. Production rates have been reduced from 15 cars per hour to 11.
- Tom Wallace, the vehicle-line executive in charge of GM's performance cars, including Corvette, has retired after 42 years at GM. Gene Stefanyshyn replaces Tom.
- John Heinrichy, Director of Performance Vehicle Operations, has also retired, being replaced by Susan Morales.
- Gary Claudio, the Group Marketing Manager, will be replaced by Todd Christensen

In all these cases, the new executive is taking on the new responsibilities in addition to retaining their current responsibilities, thus reducing the number of executives.

Also, GM has announced their pricing for the new Camaro. The base V-6 Camaro LS has an MSRP of \$22,995 (including destination charge). The Camaro SS, with 422-hp 6.2 litre LS3 V-8 has an MSRP of

\$30,995. Remember that these are US prices. Customer orders were being accepted as of October 13, 2008 and production is to start in February 2009 in Oshawa.

Elfi Arkus-Duntov, wife of Corvette icon Zora Arkus-Duntov, passed away on October 23 at St. John's Hospital in Detroit. She had been hospitalized there for several weeks with a severe leg infection. She was 93.

Together, she and Zora personified the performance and allure of the early Corvettes. Even well into their years, the pair had an energy and spark that infected everyone around them.

Funeral arrangements are pending, though Elfi will be cremated and her ashes will be joined with Zora's as part of the current tribute inside the National Corvette Museum.

No other information is available at this time.
