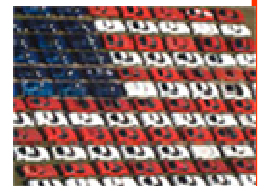
A traffic cop pulled alongside a speeding silver Z06 on the motorway. Glancing into the car, he was astounded to see that the older lady, who was driving, was knitting.

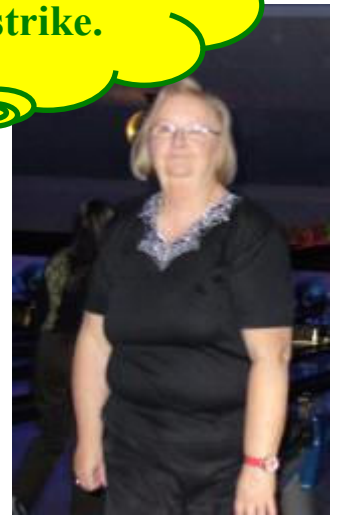

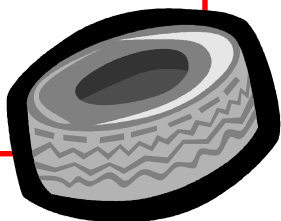
