### **Old Business:**

### **New Business:**

# Minutes from Last Meeting Cont'd

## Show Committee: Bill Colclough

NCC Car Show preparation activities are underway. Once finalized, a copy of the summary of the Activities Done Prior to the Show will be sent by Email to all members for their information. Members will be able to have a better appreciation of the activities underway and who are the Lead Persons.

Bill went through the summary of the Day of Show: Tasks and People Involved to begin the confirmation of Show volunteer workers. Once finalized, a copy of this summary will also be sent by Email to all members for their information. Members will then know who is involved in what activity during the Show.

Those people involved in the above noted activities will be asked to provide more specifics in a point form description format of what is done (e.g. for Tim Conway and Bob Brickman – their activity of hanging direction signs to the Show – need to know things such as where the signs are? where are they placed? what time is this done?). This is to provide further documentation for the Club files.

Inclement weather and other commitments have prevented Bill and Harold from walking the Show grounds with Klaus Reif to confirm the Show logistics.

A number of new ideas for the Show were discussed:

- a) Sketch Map of the grounds to be handed out as part of the Registration package  
- supported by the members
- b) Move the "Pick a Prize" location from Registration area to DJ / Raffle Prize driveway area  
- supported by the members
- c) New Vendor idea: the company that did the powder coat work for the restoration being done by John Mytroen on his 1927 Chevrolet Truck will have a display of the truck's rolling chassis  
- supported by the members
- d) Six Generations of Corvettes: Ian Bell discussed his progress to date on this idea. Member cars have been confirmed for the display. Ian is working on ideas for information posters and a banner. Members were asked to provide any printing contacts to Ian, to help minimize costs. Given that this display is expected to occur during future Shows, minimal expenses are justified.  
- supported by the members

- e) A "Central Command" location is being proposed near the Information Booth so that members will have a known spot to get help, should problems arise during the Show.  
- supported by the members
- f) An additional DJ speaker needs to be placed so that Show attendees located at the rear of the grounds get better sound.  
- supported by the members
- g) The number of banners and signs displayed at the Show needs to be reviewed as some of the signs are getting dated. If a reduced number of signs are displayed, the location of these signs needs to be reviewed to ensure good exposure.  
- supported by the members
- h) All Club members at the Show are to be Show Ambassadors. When people are seen entering the grounds with bicycles, all members need to take it upon themselves to stop this activity, noting that bicycle racks are located by the Winery.  
- supported by the members

The members were reminded that all of us working at the Show, wearing our yellow Club t-shirts, are expected to serve as Show Ambassadors. All members need to take it upon themselves to address issues raised by Show attendees (beyond the bicycle issue noted above).

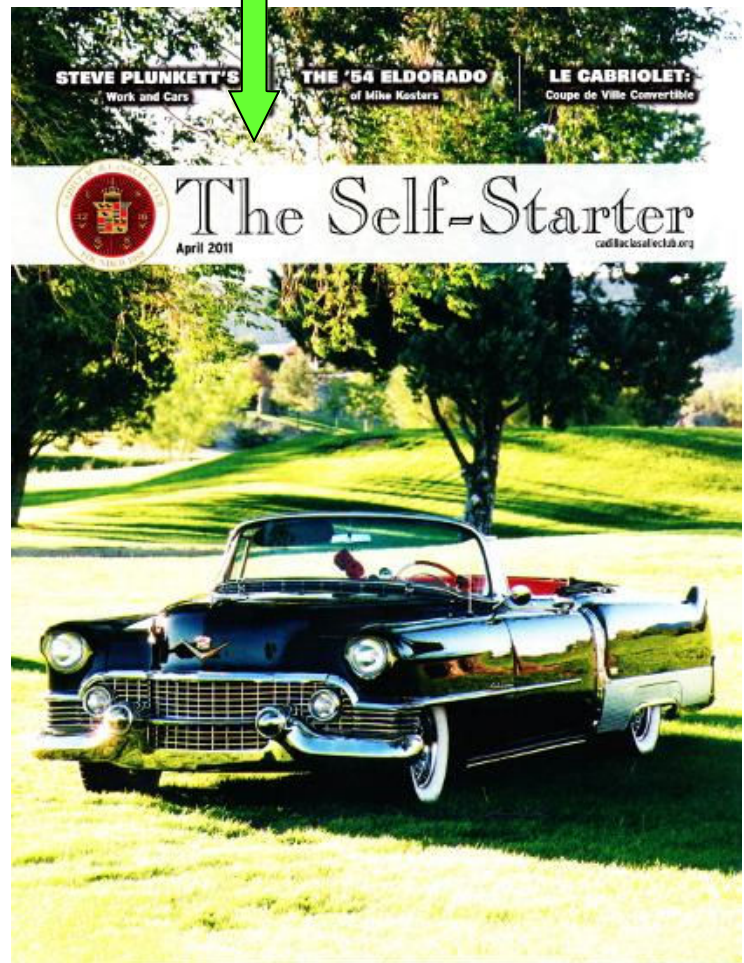
