The company's G-Vette will have the same frame that is used for stock Z06 and ZR1 Corvettes. An electric motor and battery pack are expected to zip out 600-hp, and the car's range on one charge is estimated to be 200 miles. The one-of G-Vette is supposed to be a test car for future electric cars, but the company says they might make more, if Chevrolet allows the move-and demand is high enough.

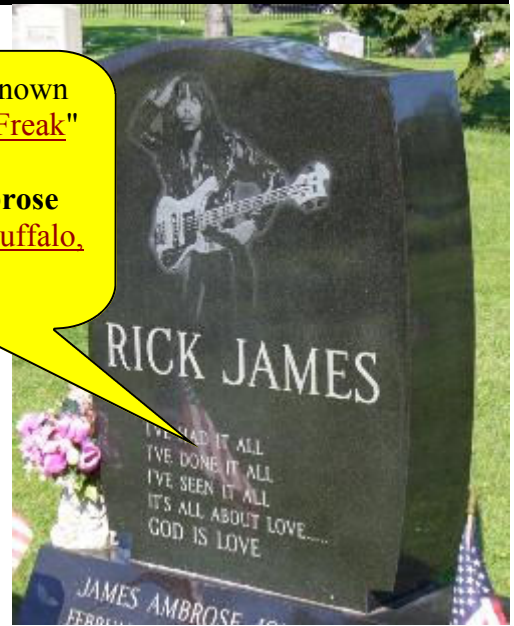

*'Father! What happened? All day long you blessed horses and they all won.*

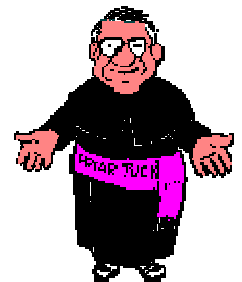
*Then in the last race, the horse you blessed lost by a Kentucky mile.*
