Chevrolet builds 1,500,000th Corvette

At the June meeting of the Greater Atlanta Automotive Media Association, Karen Rafferty, Chevrolet Product Marketing Director, announced the recent production of the 1,500,000th Corvette at GM Bowling Green Assembly Plant.

"The 1.5 millionth Corvette is a great example of how Chevy is America's Brand," Rafferty said. "For nearly 60 years we have built America's Sports Car and this milestone is a solid proof point."

The 1.5 millionth Corvette, built on May 28, is a white convertible 3LT with red interior and black top (similar to the first, 500,000th and 1 millionth Corvettes built in 1953, 1977 and 1992 respectively).

The first Corvette rolled off the assembly line on June 30, 1953.

Rafferty also announced the all-new 2010 Corvette Grand Sport.

"The Corvette Grand Sport achieves a 0 - 60 time in less than four seconds, pulls 1.0g on the skid pad and still boasts an impressive 9.0L/100km (hwy)(31 mpg)," Rafferty said. "These numbers are unmatched by any of Corvette's competitors."

GM recalls 1 vehicle due to faulty accelerator

With all the financial strife General Motors finds itself in, the last thing it needs are product recalls bringing into doubt the quality of its vehicles. Unfortunately for GM, a product recall is just what the company was forced to issue, and with 1 vehicle across the country affected people are going to take notice.

The recall affects the 2009 versions of the Corvette C6 in blue only.

The issue with the accelerator lies in an inability to effectively control engine RPM's. This issue manifests itself when drivers move the accelerator for standard cars and the engine idle RPM never returns to the normal range before hard shifting occurs. This could cause the car to damage the clutch plate. GM did not go into specifics as to what other issues could present themselves.

While currently only 1 corvette is being recalled, most are still sitting in dealer lots. Only 3 vehicles that could potentially be affected by the faulty accelerator have been sold to consumers. None of those vehicles have reported any problems relating to the recall as of yet.

This problem is hard for GM dealers to diagnose as no trouble codes are set in the computer. GM stated the solution is to reprogram the computer and pull the "Mid America rubber mats" away from the accelerator pedal.
